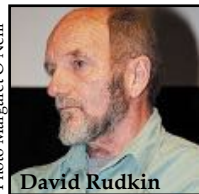

Dmitri Shostakovich (1906-1975) wrestled with fate all his life and it is his ability to triumph over crippling misfortunes that helped to make him a great composer who dominated the musical world during his lifetime.

Written between the 1930s and the 1970s, Shostakovich's fifteen string quartets span his whole career, and relate to the difficulties of life in Soviet Russia, on war and the holocaust.

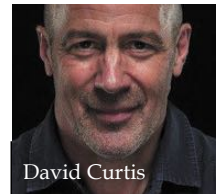

General Information

BROMSGROVE is easy to visit by car, being almost at the centre of the Midlands motorway system. It is 10 minutes from the M5 and M42, less than 2 hours from the M25, 1½ hours from Manchester and from Bristol. There are fairly frequent **trains** to Bromsgrove, but you can't rely on there being a taxi at the station - two firms to ring beforehand are 01527 837222 and 01527 570707.

ARTRIX, Slideslow Drive, Bromsgrove **B60 1PQ**
Artrix is well signed, just off the A38 Bromsgrove bypass. Bromsgrove's arts centre was designed with the performance of music in mind and the acoustics are excellent for string quartets. There is a large foyer and a bar for sandwiches, coffee, alcoholic and soft drinks. Meals for Gold Savers will be in the building. The seating for the Shostakovich weekend will be unnumbered so you can choose where to sit for each concert once you have seen the hall.

ACCESS for wheelchairs at Artrix is easy, but it would be helpful to know beforehand. 01527 577330

PARKING is plentiful and free.

ACCOMMODATION

We would advise booking accommodation early. The Bromsgrove Central Premier Inn is three minutes walk across Artrix car park. There are numerous other hotels, but very few b&bs. Regrettably there is no Bromsgrove TIC but Droitwich TIC have a useful list of hotels in the area (01905 774312). Otherwise the internet is probably the easiest way to find what would suit you.
